MR. DUNCAN: Pardon me, but I was looking at my notes wrong. I did have just one comment on 17.2 because it was paragraph 9.

CHAIRPERSON HUSER: That's fine. I'm moving quickly, so you may go back to that.

MR. DUNCAN: In our comments on 17.2(9) we had noted that the Board proposes to have a 50 percent discount for gas and electric utilities exempt from rate regulation, and we had suggested in our comments that the same kind of a discount, 50 percent discount, be applied to telecommunications service providers in the calculation of remainder expenses, and it has come to our attention that the Iowa Code specifically creates the exemption for gas and electric companies and not for telecom service providers, so I understand that the Board may not be able to act on our request absent legislative change.

CHAIRPERSON HUSER: And, Mr. Duncan, one of the reasons that I want to make sure that all the parties have an opportunity to look at our formulas is I believe that the 50 percent calculation had been used for telecommunications in the past, and at least one-and-a-half billing cycles while I was on the Board. The formulas behind those numbers are what

need to be reviewed.

BOARD MEMBER LOZIER: Excuse me. I would like to follow up on that point.

Is there somewhere else in the Code--and I ask this of Mr. Duncan and Mr. Pietila--that would give the Board the authority, you know, at its own discretion to reduce the charge to remainder assessments for telecom?

MR. DUNCAN: Pardon me, but I would have to do a little research in the Code. I don't have that at my disposal right now.

BOARD MEMBER LOZIER: Okay. Thank you.

BOARD MEMBER WAGNER: Mr. Lozier, I can give you my opinion, if you would like it.

BOARD MEMBER LOZIER: Well, of course. I think I'm going to get it anyway.

rather vague. When you read it it says the Board can charge whatever it wants to capture costs that it has. I think that sort of gives us the discretion if we so choose. I mean we have the discretion to waive if a company has a concern with their assessment. We've reduced assessments in the past. So I think when you read that section, there's quite a bit of latitude the Board is given, at least in my nonlegal

engineer opinion.

BOARD MEMBER LOZIER: There are other rules of statutory construction that come into play here, one of which is that the specific controls the general and that things omitted are omitted intentionally.

BOARD MEMBER WAGNER: Yeah.

BOARD MEMBER LOZIER: And whether the broad discretion given to the Board supersedes that is the question that I think we need to consider. But I appreciate your nonlegal opinion.

BOARD MEMBER WAGNER: Because I would be interested in hearing from any of the other non-telecommunications parties on their thoughts with respect to the telecommunications industry being assessed at 50 percent versus a hundred percent, or even the OCA.

BOARD MEMBER LOZIER: Well, it's only the remainder assessment that would be at 50 percent.

BOARD MEMBER WAGNER: Yes, but we technically, by function, don't have remainder anymore. It's either direct or industry.

BOARD MEMBER LOZIER: Right. So in practice, it might be a moot point.

BOARD MEMBER WAGNER: Right.
