

Dear Members of the Iowa Utilities Board,

I'm filing an objection in an open docket against HLP-2021-0003 (Navigator CO2 Ventures LLC, Petition for a Hazardous Liquid Pipeline Permit) because the project is an obvious case of "greenwashing."

Navigator's pipeline is designed to carry liquid CO2 for "industrial use" (David Giles, COO of Navigator) to Illinois, a fossil-fuel producing state, and Navigator's partner in charge of the sequestration site, ARI, openly describes itself as a corporation focused on "enhanced oil recovery." EOR results in a net *addition* of CO2 to the atmosphere. Why are out-of-state oil and gas interests being given the green light on a project that we know will only delay our country's shift to a better future? Why haven't scientists from the Iowa Geological Survey been given a seat at the table when discussing sequestration? (Isn't it because any storage of CO2 in Iowa would not be suitable for EOR?) And why should individual Iowans be forced to put their land, their farms, their communities and their families at risk so that this corporation from Texas can rake in private profits?

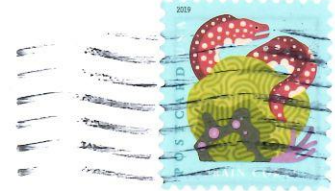

Right now Navigator isn't telling us exactly what they will do with the CO2 but they can do whatever they choose in the future. I am vehemently opposed to the pipeline and urge The IUB to reject the permit.

Reject the permit because:

- 1) It's greenwashing for ethanol disguised as a serious attempt to address climate change. Building and maintaining massive pipeline infrastructure, growing the corn to make ethanol and then burning that ethanol in cars, burning the fossil fuels that will be mined by the frackers in Illinois, together will generate more CO2 than the pipeline will capture. This thing could quite easily contribute to climate change instead of slowing it, and will certainly distract us from working on meaningful, effective solutions.
- 2) It's another way for powerful people in business and government to make a lot of money while the rest of us and the environment bear the cost, risk, and hassle. The infrastructure bill just signed opened the door for big money to be made by somebody, in this case, somebody from Texas who has zero interest in the welfare of rural Iowans. Taxpayers/citizens bear the costs of climate change, relatively permanent damage and danger to our land and communities, and then we give them tax credits. Doesn't make any sense to those of us who actually pay taxes.
- 3) It's not safe. When a pipeline fails, the gas travels far and fast. CO2 pipelines are relatively unproven technology and haven't been without problems, and CO2 kills within minutes but it's odorless and colorless so you don't even know you are being suffocated.
- 4) Pipeline construction will damage not only crop fields, but also natural areas, wetlands, and timber. They need a corridor of one hundred feet for the machinery to bury the pipe, so all 150-year-old oak trees and everything else in the way will have to go as construction begins. We need our oak trees, prairies, wetlands, windbreaks, Indian mounds, rock outcrops, and streams. We don't need compaction from massive machines, soil turned upside down, drainage pathways disturbed, or stable landscapes disrupted.

5) The route will inevitably get close to rural homes. Refer back to point Number Three. Would any of the investors like to live with a hazardous liquid pipeline where their kids play?

Thank you for hearing my concerns. Reject this permit.

Dear Iowa Utilities Board

I am writing to protest the CO2 Pipeline. I am greatly concerned for the health and safety of myself and all Iowans affected by this proposal as well as the land. I find it very distressing that money has become the only bottom line in America; particularly when it tops human lives and the future of the world.

This pipeline will rape the land of Iowa farmers. The farmers are already doing cover crops, planting trees, and employing no till methods, which does carbon sequestration with no danger to anyone. This pipeline is not going through isolated, land miles from schools, churches, productive farmland and communities, it rips through the heart of my neighbor's farm. She walks and drives that property every day. Her livestock are dependent upon it. Her crops are raised with care on it. We must protect the land of our neighbors. If an accidental explosion happens there, there are many neighbors within a distance that will also be affected, even if it does not go through their land, myself included.

- These Waste pipelines pose a significant safety concern and dangerous risk as evidenced with the Sartartia COS gas pipeline in Mississippi. The green fog which was formed by the explosion was so toxic that within a few minutes people started collapsing. These people suffered long term effects including: mental fogginess, lung dysfunction, chronic fatigue, stomach disorders trouble sleeping and anxiety. The situation continues to unfold in regards to the effects on those exposed. A vast amount of CO2 is contaminated with hydrogen sulfide which increases the corrosiveness and serious health effects of CO2.
- According to a 2020 study in biophysical Economics and Sustainability, a 65,000-mile pipeline would only handle 15% of the current greenhouse gas emissions in the US, yet to have any effect on climate change would require a pipeline larger than the petroleum pipeline system which totals 2.6 million miles.
- CIEL and the Environmental working Group. has stated Repurposing oil and gas lines will not work as COS is corrosive and will eat through the carbon steel used in petroleum pipelines if contaminated with even a small amount of water. Research shows that CO2 from the common carbon capture technique is highly likely to have water in it. COS pipelines run at significantly higher pressure than natural gas and that requires more energy consuming compressor stations along the line. Because of the increased pressure, explosive decompression of a CO2 pipeline releases a significantly increased amount of gas much faster than a gas pipeline
- In closing I will share a statement from the Sierra club:

CO2 Pipelines Proposed in Iowa:

1. Summit Carbon Solutions, aka Bruce Rastetter's CO2 Pipeline. Bruce Rastetter's Pipeline Connects ethanol plants and other industrial ag facilities to a pipeline that leads to North Dakota. From there the CO2 will be stored underground or will be used for Enhanced Oil Recovery.

CCS is a false solution in this instance because:

- It does not address other emissions or forms of pollution from fossil fuel extraction and industrial agriculture
- It will allow for the extension of fossil fuel extraction through enhanced oil recovery
- Fails to acknowledge CO2 is incredibly dangerous and a pipeline leak or break could poison surrounding communities and first responders

2. Navigator CO2 Pipeline. The Navigator pipeline connects ethanol and fertilizer plants in Iowa to a pipeline that leads to Illinois where the CO2 will be used for Enhanced Oil Recovery or for storage underground.

CCS is a false solution in this instance because:

- It will extend the life of polluting ethanol industry and industrial agriculture practices that have contributed to our climate crisis, water pollution and more.
- CCS continues business as usual and delays investment in REAL climate solutions

In both proposals, CCS is a false solution that takes us farther away from our climate goals. Allowing these pipelines to continue business as usual, will only be feasible with massive public subsidies, and should not be approved. Let's invest in REAL climate solutions.

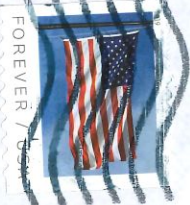

I am opposed to the Navigator Heartland Greenway project. The use of carbon capture and storage (CCS) as a reliable technology to reduce CO2 emissions from industry is unproven, and at best, is only a very small part of the solution needed to reverse our current course of global warming.

The failure of Chevron's Gordon LNG project in Western Australia to meet carbon capture goals is an example of what we are learning about CCS over time. While Chevron committed to capturing at least 80% of the CO2 that would otherwise be released by the Gordon LNG project, it only managed to capture 30% over a five year time period (2016 - 2021). Quoting from the industry newsletter, Upstream Energy Explored, "It is a shocking failure of one of the world's largest engineering projects. But, given the lack of rigor and testing around the technology that was used...it is [not] unexpected."

The recently passed Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and the pending Build Back Better legislation both include tax credits for technologies such as CCS. However, these tax credits were in no way intended to be the primary tool for reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions to our target goal of 50-52% of 2005 levels by 2030. As recently noted, again from industry media, the advances in reducing GHG through tax credits will be overshadowed by the continued growth of the fossil fuel industry over this same time period. Tax credits for CCS may enable some reduction in GHG emissions for large industrial sources, but they do not address most of this sector's emissions. In order to reduce GHG we need to reduce the use of fossil fuels and look for more effective ways to remove CO2 emissions at their source. Solar powered CO2 conversion developed by our own NASA scientists is a great example (<https://technology.nasa.gov/patent/TOP2-160>).

I urge the Iowa Utilities Board to take into consideration the massive impact of a 1,300 mile hazardous pipeline across the state of Iowa as compared to its limited capacity to move us toward important environmental goals. Surely, this project is not in the public good and Navigator's request for a permit should be denied.

1. The pipeline will have lasting negative effects on the environment, including but not limited to loss of forest, new erosion patterns because of the trenching and the travel by pipeline workers to check the lines), soil removal, fence line destruction, and if leaks, change in temperature which will kill plant life, and any breathing creatures nearby.
2. CO2 pipelines have different more dangerous potential problems because of corrosion to the lines caused by impurities contained with the liquid CO2, and the highly adverse effects on the environment caused by the release of these impurities if leaks occur. I am writing today to express my opposition to the Heartland Greenway proposed project. I am opposed because this project is not "green" and does not constitute a public good. This is using eminent domain for corporate greed. And it is truly time that we stop taking orders from the oil and gas lobby and industry. It is time to move on before the cost of and ability to mediate climate change is beyond human capability.

Navigator states that the liquid CO₂ carried in its pipeline will be permanently sequestered in Illinois. Are they telling the whole story? I believe that is a safe bet that they are not. Sequestration is only the first part of a larger industrial cycle utilized by the oil and gas industry to extract more fossil fuels from fields that are otherwise depleted. Is Navigator building a pipeline that will transport CO₂ *only* for the purpose of sequestration (thereby lowering carbon emissions), or are they preparing their project for other "industrial" uses (contributing even *more* carbon emissions in the long run)? Also a safe bet that they are.

Want more fracking earthquakes? Let's shove more "stuff" into the ground. According to Navigator's own news release "Navigator Approved to Proceed with Development and Construction of Heartland Greenway System in Midwest" (2021), "Navigator is also in discussions with multiple parties that consume CO₂ who would desire delivery interconnection points to provide a ratable, consistent source for CO₂ acquisition." At the Linn County Informational Meeting on December 6, 2021, David Giles, Navigator's Chief Operating Officer, admitted that, "If the customer wants another use for CCS [beyond sequestration] we will consider that." While David Giles went on to imply that "industrial uses" for CO₂ might include the food and beverage industry. ADM has been shipping tankers of CO₂ for that use for decades. Navigator's own partners at the sequestration site in Illinois, Tenaska and ARI, describe themselves as leaders in fracking and enhanced oil recovery (EOR). Let's be clear: ARI does not make carbonated beverages.

This project is to cut through 5th generation family farms. It will go through fragile areas. It will go too near occupied residences. It will go too near the largest public park in Linn County. It will cut through Iowa's beautiful Grant Wood country. It saddens me that this is even under consideration.

Navigator's CO₂ pipeline project is not "green" as they would like people to believe. It is not a public good. I oppose the project because it will not benefit the people of our beautiful state. It will only fill the coffers of a corporation. For the future of this planet, **please vote no** to Navigator's application.

Climate science prevails over politics

This letter does not criticize Monica Tranel, but focuses on her letter of Dec 19, about climate change. The journal “Science of Climate Change” published my landmark paper on this subject on Dec. 14.

Mrs. Tranel’s letter makes the following invalid assumptions.

First, her letter assumes the definition of “climate change” is that human emissions cause it. However, “climate change” means that climate simply changes whatever the cause.

Second, her letter incorrectly assumes events prove their cause, writing “the impact of climate change is hitting hard... We already see its effects in Montana.” My book Climate Miracle shows why this assumption is invalid even in legal trials. Third, her letter assumes we should believe the COP26 attendees who say, “the climate crisis will never be averted without international agreements and concerted action.”

The United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) defines climate change science. But the IPCC bases its conclusions on one big invalid assumption, namely, that natural CO2 stayed constant since 1750 and human CO2 caused all the CO2 increase. All climate laws, regulations, treaties, and taxes are based on this invalid assumption.

My paper uses IPCC’s own data to prove this assumption is false and shows natural CO2, not human CO2, dominates the CO2 increase. Other scientists have checked my calculations and proved them correct.

Here are some simple reasons to help you understand why the IPCC is wrong.

IPCC admits natural CO2 emissions are 20 times human CO2 emissions. So, to the first approximation, because CO2 that flows into the atmosphere flows out, like water flows through a lake, human CO2 is only 5 percent of today’s atmospheric CO2, not 30 percent as IPCC incorrectly assumes.

More accurately, my paper calculates the flow of human CO2 back into the atmosphere, which shows human CO2 is 8 percent while natural CO2 is 92 percent.

The IPCC counters that human CO2 stays in the atmosphere longer than natural CO2 causing the human portion to be 30 percent. Thus, the IPCC digs its own grave. This IPCC claim is absurd because human and natural CO2 molecules are identical, so they flow out of the atmosphere at the same rate.

IPCC’s story would require a magic demon in the atmosphere to separate human from natural CO2 molecules, and then detain the human molecules. IPCC’s climate fiction is so absurd that it proves the IPCC did not just error but committed a fraud of global proportions.

Even the 2021 emissions reduction due to COVID did not stop the inevitable CO2 increase caused by natural CO2, further proving climate treaties and green energy are useless because they ignore that unstoppable nature is the dominant cause of the CO2 increase. Carbon-14 data independently prove nature dominates the CO2 increase.

My paper shows if human CO2 emissions were to stop, the small human-caused increase would quickly fall, meaning there is no scientific basis to claim there is a climate emergency or worry about our grand kids.

Dear Members of the Iowa Utilities Board:

I write to you as attorney for affected land owners, those individuals and/or entities owning the S ½ SW ¼ of Section 11, Township 90 North, Range 32 West of the 5th P.M., Pocahontas County, Iowa, to object to the current proposal submitted to the Iowa Utilities Board for a CO2 Pipeline.

Iowa Code Section 479B.9 provides, in relevant part:

“A permit **shall not** be granted to a pipeline company unless the Board determines that the proposed services will **promote the public convenience and necessity.**” (Emphasis applied)

In its present form, Navigator’s proposal comes nowhere close to meeting this threshold standard for issuing a permit. This proposed pipeline does not promote the public convenience and is certainly not a necessity. The public will not be inconvenienced should this proposal be permitted; rather, many, like my clients, will be greatly inconvenienced. Their fertile fields will be dug up, drainage tiles breached, and ground compacted. As a consequence, their farming operations will be disrupted for years. A disruption endured all for the convenience, not of the public, but for the convenience of a private company.

There is no public necessity for this project to be permitted. It may or may not be necessary to capture CO2 produced by ethanol plants, this is a matter upon which there is no consensus but without any question, it is not necessary that this perceived problem be addressed by transmitting CO2 by pipeline across Iowa to be buried in Illinois. There are other means for addressing this perceived problem, (ethanol plants are currently capturing and selling CO2 for other industrial and academic use) that are less experimental, less costly, and less disruptive to others, such as my clients. In fact, the proposition that it is a public necessity to transport CO2 by pipeline across Iowa to bury underneath Illinois, is much less than above reproach, it is, in fact, near farsical.

Importantly, this proposed project's economic viability, appears to be dependent upon government largesse, as opposed to free market principles. As such, its success, particularly over a period of years, will depend on the political climate. Certainly, this Board will not permit a project financially dependent on the political climate of the moment, that will require long term maintenance and repair to avoid catastrophic damages to farms such as my clients.

In addition to failing to meet the standard for issuing a permit, this proposal, by going through my client's land, will disrupt a recently installed and costly public drainage facility. The installation of this pipeline would immediately disrupt the benefit of this public drainage facility and pose a possible long term threat to the efficiency of this public drainage facility. As such, the installation of the proposed pipeline, if granted, should take an alternate route to avoid disruption this recently installed and critical public drainage facility.

For the above reasons, and other, my clients strongly urge this Board deny the permit requested.

Comments: Dear IUB: The proposed route of the Navigator hazardous liquid CO2 will impact our family farm. Our farm already has a high voltage electrical transmission line crossing our property. We also have a Buckeye petroleum pipeline crossing our farm. We live on a well traveled hard surface road. The proposed pipeline will cross directly under the high voltage line. The pipeline would then cross the hard surface road. Approximately 1.5 mi. from crossing the road the Navigator pipeline will intersect the Buckeye petroleum pipeline. It is a short distance after crossing the Buckeye pipeline for the Navigator pipeline to cross the Cedar River south of Mt. Vernon, Ia. The proposed Navigator pipeline is also in close proximity to the Palisades State Park-Dows Preserve and the Eastern Iowa Observatory. This area has a abundant wildlife population. 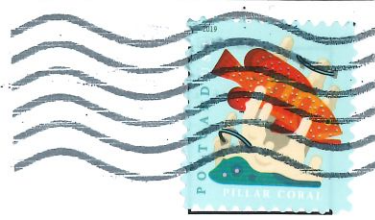

Dear Board Members

I own land in Poweshiek County and the Navigator CO2 pipeline is mapped to cross my land. I am not in favor of this pipeline for many reasons. I am very concerned about the safety of the pipeline and the disastrous effects a blowout could have on my family that live nearby. CO2 poisoning is horrible and can be deadly. CO2 can travel a long distance settling in the river and moving to towns like Guernsey. A blowout would also kill much of the wildlife in the area and surrounding livestock.

The financial impact of this pipeline is also very troubling. There are several factors which would affect my income and also the income of my son, who currently farms the land. This land is good cropland. I have invested in tiling for drainage. The heavy equipment used to put in the pipeline will extensively damage the drainage system on some of my best land. Even if Navigator replaces the tiling, I am concerned the land will never be the same again.

I am also very uneasy about the state my soil will be in after the pipeline goes through. Navigator only offers a partial compensation payment for 3 years. Even if the topsoil is removed and returned on top I have read studies showing the land is not back to pre-pipeline production after 3 years. This could be a large loss of income for my family and other farmers in the path of this pipeline.

Another concern I have is with my Conservation Reserve Program acres. Due to the poor maps provided by Navigator I am not positive where the pipeline will actually go. I have many acres of CRP land in this area. This ground has to be maintained as natural grass areas or I lose my government CRP payments. We are not allowed to drive on this land or even mow it without special permission. I can't imagine what will happen if Navigator basically destroys this natural area. The wildlife this program tries to protect will all be driven out. If the pipeline is put in place and Navigator does reseed the area, the conservation board may not like the way the land looks. The conservation board can cancel my contract. Where will Navigator be during all of this? I'm sure they won't be at the board hearing as I try to plead my case to save my CRP land. I could lose all future CRP payments, plus I could be forced to repay past payments for breach of contract. I am a retired, widow. I rely on those CRP payments and certainly can't repay past payments. All of this is of no fault of mine but I am the one that will suffer.

This pipeline has so many red flags telling us it is a bad idea. From safety issues to loss of income and land values. I'm just one person, but there are thousand with stories similar to mine playing out all across the state. This pipeline will have a negative impact on so many Iowans. As the IOWA Utilities Board, I believe you must choose to put Iowans first. Maintain landowner right by voting against eminent domain. For your fellow Iowans- stop the navigator CO2 pipeline.

This soon to be "Century Farm" has district county pipelines placed there when my Grandfather farmed it.

On behalf of the citizens of Emmet County and the state of Iowa, we write today to register our concerns and unanimous opposition to the CO2 pipeline projects proposed by Summit and Navigator (IUB Docket #'s HLP-2021-0001 and HLP-2021-0003). While many of the lessor concerns can and will be addressed by the private investor's checkbook, we offer these three irreconcilable issues that will have lasting effect and do irreparable damage to our county's agricultural welfare and ownership rights.

DRAINAGE: The largest industry in Emmet County and our neighboring counties is agriculture. The rights of land owners to have, maintain, and improve drainage is critical to their success. Drainage tile is designed and installed based on grade and elevation, the option of going around future pipelines is not available. This proposed project will allow private investors to profit while limiting future improvements and productivity of the land. Additionally, it is inevitable that there will be damage to existing drainage tile and without appropriate legislation on the state and county levels, there is no protection for the private tile already installed.

SAFETY: Our primary responsibility as elected officials of this county is to protect and stand for the safety of our citizens. This means not only protecting them from unnecessary risks but also preparing for an unfortunate event that might bring harm. While the merits of this project are a topic addressed later, planning for response to an accidental discharge of the concentrated CO2 will require additional training at great expense to our county. Our regional Hazmat team is located in Mason City, approximately 2 hours away, and even though our volunteer fire fighters and first responders are well trained and equipped, they are not prepared to provide the urgent response needed if a problem with the pipeline would occur. The proposed route for the Navigator line would travel approximately 6 miles south of our second largest incorporated community Armstrong, and just north of our third,

that of Ringsted. In their presentation, the Navigator representatives stated that they had chosen routes to avoid large population densities but in Emmet, 2/5th of our entire population lies in the path.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENT: Emmet County continues to be limited by available infrastructure for future industrial development. Even though we have documented some of the strongest wind resource in the state and host the nationally known Wind Industry program at Iowa Lakes Community College, we have only two towers in the county. One is privately owned to service a livestock feeding operation and the other is the training turbine at ILCC. Emmet County has been overlooked because we do not have connection to and are not close enough to the "Grid". We are also overlooked as our natural gas supply will not support increased usage by an industrial venture. The installation of the two pipelines to support the travel through Emmet again represents usage without benefit to our county. These pipelines will further impede the installation and placement of the much needed infrastructure, that of fiber optics, gas, and electric both in and out of the county.

With respect to landowner rights, the use of the eminent domain/condemnation process to acquire easements for the private investors will destroy the rights of the land owners. We hold grave concerns for the precedence it will set and further how those easements might transfer through legal channels to others without consideration for the land owners. The definition of property ownership will be challenged if this private venture is allowed to proceed. The benefits to the general population derived by eminent domain are far different than what will be established by this private interest.

Finally, we would like to address the merits or lack of same that this project represents. While we understand that the production of Ethanol as a benefit to our agricultural industry, the need to pipe CO2 from the ethanol plants around but not in our county are less documented. An acre of corn requires eight tons of CO2 for its production. Iowa produces approximately 13.5 million acres of corn annually. The numbers don't lie; the pipelines designed to transport 15 million tons annually address only a small fraction of the CO2 actually naturally absorbed by our corn production. Production of corn is good for the environment. In addition, the Nitrous Oxide which is 282% more hazardous to the environment is allowed to escape as there is less interest in protecting the environment from this harmful bi-product when compared to this unneeded pipeline which is merely a money maker for the investors. Environmentally, the entire project mirrors the credentials of the recent West Des Moines Water Works law suit against the three northwestern counties for damages caused by nitrogen entering the Raccoon River. When the facts were revealed, there was expense to remove the nitrogen but then what was removed was returned to the water downstream. The concerns for the environment were only an excuse for profit.

Thank you for your consideration of our concerns and other CO2 alternatives in "The Guardian" article. (See link below) Please know that we write to you on behalf of our citizens and appreciate your attention to this very important issue.

1. Eminent Domain will be used if approved. Transporting carbon across Iowa into another state does NOT serve a public purpose. Geologists here in Iowa have stated that there is not a need to transport it out of Iowa when we can put carbon into our subsurface rock formations.
2. Safety of the pipeline. It has been proven how destructive a break or rupture could be. The proposed route takes it near the cities of Mechanicsville, Stanwood, Clarence, and Lowden which are higher populated areas. Emergency Services would not be able to support this, and the pipeline says it would supply personnel that could get there in less than one hour. Released carbon takes seconds to kill. This leaves many residents at risk for deadly results.
3. There is a major highway and railroad in the corridor. Highway 30 is supposed to be expanded and this will impact traffic too if an accident happens.

I am opposed to this CO2 pipeline. If it goes through where it is mapped, it will be going through land known to have been inhabited by Native Americans. I personally have found artifacts on the land owned by Dennis and Anita Kimm and that owned by James Schmuecker. Both are my neighbors. There are known burial sites in the neighboring farms that are on record at the University of Iowa Archaeology department. I have seen a map at the University in the 1990s showing many more in the neighborhood that somehow are not on record anymore. Do you really want to take the chance of disturbing a grave site? Do you want the Native American's protesting your disruption of a grave site?

Also, the hills you are talking about going through are covered with timber. Do you plan to have the land owner log it first? Do you then plan to remove any remaining tree parts for chipping and shredding or other uses? I would HIGHLY object to your burning the tree residue. That would be a contradiction of what you claim is your main purpose, that of reducing CO2 emissions. Plus, trees remove CO2 from the air and replace it with oxygen. Removing the number of trees you are talking about would greatly reduce the CO2 removed and the Oxygen produced.

Removing trees from these hills would lead to erosion. The area in question next to me is in the PRICE CREEK Watershed protected area. Erosion would greatly affect this watershed.

The soil in this area has about 6 inches of top soil and then it turns to clay. Red clay and Blue clay. Once that clay layer is disturbed, it erodes very quickly. It is very hard to get any cover crop to grow in the clay. Both farmers next to me have fields in CRP. This is to protect and improve the wildlife in the area. You would be disrupting the wildlife we have all been trying to protect.

My acreage is located in Section 11, Washington Township, Iowa County, Iowa. I am in the lower right quarter of the section. Dennis Kimm is in the lower left quarter section and James Schmuecker is in the top right quarter of the section. I have lived here over 60 years and dad bought this farm in 1948 when he returned from a year in occupied Japan after his service during WWII.

I wish to go on record in opposition to the construction of the proposed Summit Carbon Solutions pipeline through part of our Century Farm. With rapidly advancing technology, it seems possible that a more feasible solution could be invented, that doesn't disturb some of the most fertile farm land in the world. Such technology could make this disruptive pipeline unnecessary. I don't believe that our tax credits should be used for a venture of this type. The negatives outnumber the positives, and I oppose the use of eminent domain. The people who stand to gain financially from this proposed project are not, for the most part, the ones whose land/drainage systems will be permanently negatively impacted. I assume that the pipeline isn't being buried by hand, or using electric-powered machinery. How much carbon, then, would be expelled during the construction of said pipeline?

In O'Brien County, NIPCO already has a perpetual easement and powerlines on land in the proposed pipeline corridor. An unexpected explosion near this main electric transmission line could be very disruptive of electrical service to many citizens. We already have another higher-powered, Mid-American owned, transmission line (serving 200+ wind turbines, at a nearby substation), going through our Century Farm.

Our great-grandfather found artifacts from the Mill Creek Indians in the creek bed that runs through the proposed easement area. Also, an outlet of a large-diameter tile line, draining several sections of farm land into Mill Creek, is in the proposed right-of-way.

Past experience from the two natural gas pipelines, and a rural water pipeline, on our farm, resulted in excessive soil compaction and loss of fertility over the long term. No matter how carefully the soil is removed and replaced, the results are disruptive, if not destructive to good soil health.

As a footnote, the initial map mailed to landowners showed the City of Primghar to be located where the City of Sheldon actually is. {See attachment} If the developers were this careless, initially, it makes me wonder what other blunders await us! Please deny the permitting process. Thanks for your consideration.

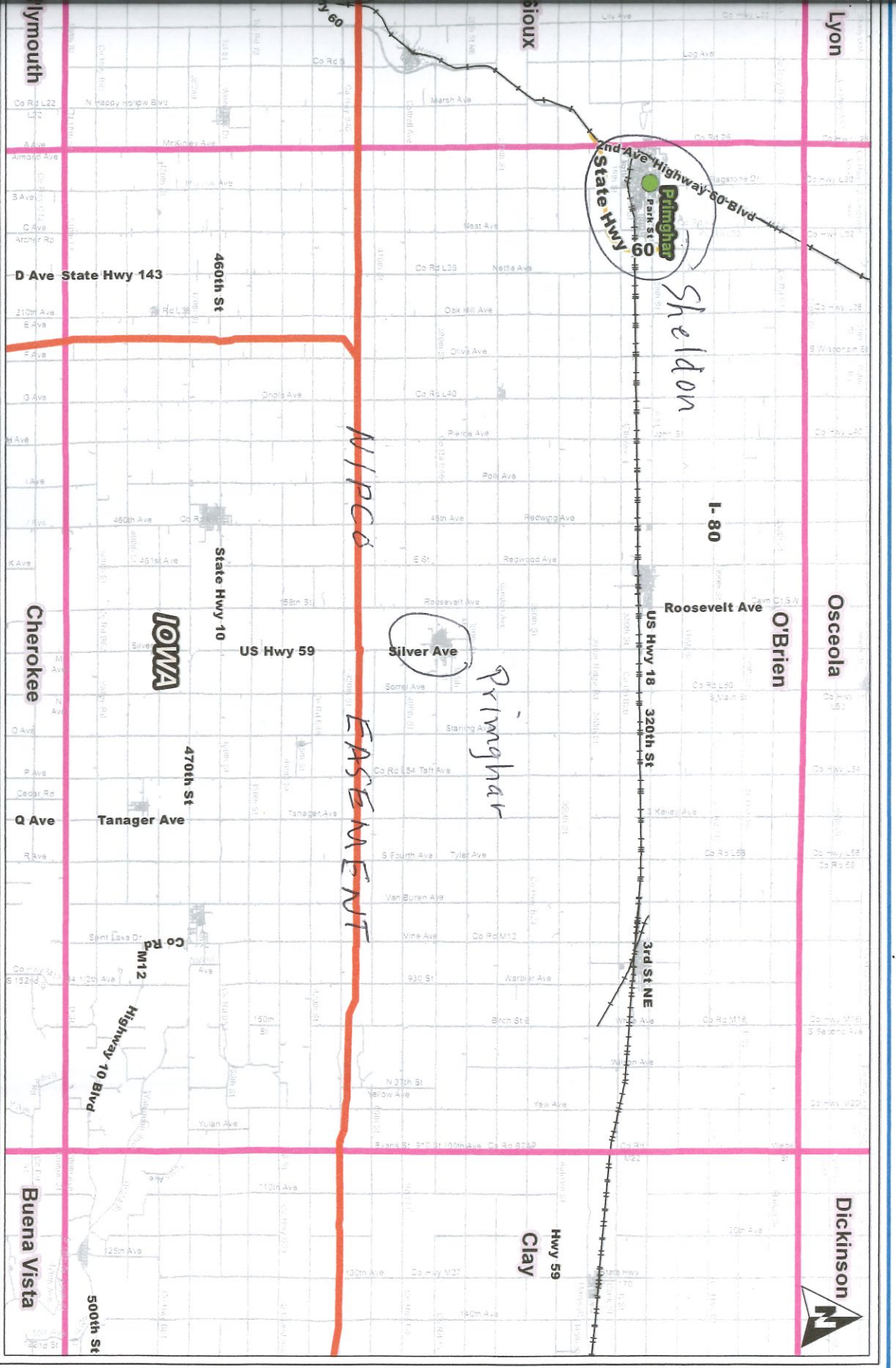

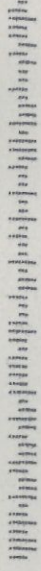

- 1) It's greenwashing for ethanol disguised as a serious attempt to address climate change. To start, yes, I have deep concerns for the risks of a toxic pipeline on the safety of my family and farm animals and I have concern for the use of eminent domain for the profit of private companies. I am sure that you have read numerous letters in this regard, so I am going to limit this letter to the special needs of my alpaca farm.

I have a small, 10-acre, alpaca farm. My animals consist of 17 alpacas, 1 llama, and a few other smaller pets. We take on special-needs alpacas to live their lifetime on our farm as sanctuary. These animals are not livestock and cannot be replaced.

Our farm is very hilly with very little flat land. It is a small area, where the little bit of flat land is carefully used for animal housing, as alpacas do not tolerate heat or cold. We have two ponds to provide available water to two of the groups and supplement with watering bins for the other two groups. Special fencing was installed with precision for "four distinct groups" of alpacas to accommodate their special needs—their groups are carefully constructed and cannot be combined or switched.

Alpacas are somewhat strong in build, but very weak in emotion. Even with strong, healthy alpacas, stress can kill. Examples of stressors that can kill even the strongest of alpacas include loud noises, change in diet, movement to a new area, transport, removal of one or more of the alpacas in a cohesive group, new people in their group area, etc.

Alpacas are sensitive to heat and cold, so need to have access to a dry area with bedding surface not too cold. Males and females must be kept separate.

Examples of Stressors to Alpacas caused by Pipeline Installation and maintenance that could cause death include:

- Movement of fences to change grazing areas (even in temporary situations).
- Loud noises—heavy equipment
- People – New people in the area causing the alpaca leader to stress out while trying to protect the herd.
- Change in water or food sources: Different pasture or water source
- Removal of or change in location of loafing shed or other buildings.

Please realize that alpacas are not livestock—they are stressed by change and this change can cause illness and sometimes death. Now, add the needs of alpacas with specific medical needs and you can see that the disruption of installing a pipeline (noise, movement of animals, etc.) will harm my animals. Let me tell you about 3 of my special-needs alpacas:

- Spot: We adopted this girl after she almost died of consuming a small amount of opossum feces. Fortunately, she survived, but she has a brain injury causing her to talk sideways. She needs to be kept in a flat area with a small group of female alpacas. Following is this week's example of accommodation for Spot. With the impending cold weather, we moved Spot and her group to the barn. I put a coat on her to help her (she was shivering). She was stressed so laid down and would not get up. We put a rubber matt under her to protect her from the cold of the barn floor. Several hours later, she stood up--without the rubber matt her body temperature would have dropped with possible death following.
- Rocky: Rocky came to us unvaccinated. He had meningeal worms and almost died. The result was that the back half of his body is weak. Not only is it difficult for him to get around, he has to have oil in his feed to aid processing. He needs to be in flat pasture with a small group of calm males.
- Sebastian: Sebastian has an immune deficiency causing an infection in his hair follicles. He needs regular application of medicine and special feed to increase his Zinc levels. He is at risk both physically and mentally.

When at the Cedar Rapids meeting, I briefly mentioned to the Navigator group my concern for stress on animals during the installation of the pipeline as well as stress caused by on-going access to the easement area for people and/or equipment. Their answer was to move the animals to pens and provide money to replace any animals that die. Perhaps they were thinking of common livestock, or perhaps their hearts are driven by the almighty dollar.

Eminent domain will cost me my farm, as my alpacas cannot tolerate disturbance of pipeline installation and the access to easement land by strangers. Please block eminent domain. Your vote will save my farm.

1) It's greenwashing for ethanol disguised as a serious attempt to address climate change. I am a landowner in Poweshiek County who received a notification letter from Navigator regarding the Heartland Greenway pipeline. Their CO2 pipeline is planned to cross my land.

I am deeply troubled by the safety concerns involving this proposed pipeline. Our home is very close to the pipeline, as are the houses of many of our neighbors. Pipeline blowouts in the past have caused serious injury and illness with long term effects. In Satartia MS (2020) a cloud of green haze from a CO2 blowout left residents confused, unable to breath, foaming at the mouth, caused convulsions and left people unconscious. Many people were unable to escape this nightmare because their cars would not run. It is my understanding CO2 settles to the ground, replacing oxygen. Without oxygen gas engines will not work. Without running vehicles residents were left stranded- desperately ill and unable to escape the area. Rescuers were also unable to enter the area. The local rescue crews in Satartia were totally unprepared. They didn't have the proper safety equipment to help the residents and with vehicles stalling no way to reach them.

Our local fire service comes from Deep River IA. A town of not even 250 people with a small volunteer fire department. We are great supporters of our local fire dept. but there is no way they are trained or equipped to deal with a CO2 pipeline blowout. The same is true for rescue services in towns all across the projected pipeline route. Rescues of this nature require full hazmat suits and extensive training. Even large cities like Cedar Rapids only have a few of these suits and in rural areas they are not available.

There is currently only a small amount of CO2 pipelines in the US but there have been other accidents. Blowouts have occurred in Tinsley MS (2011) and Delhi MS (2013). Both of these blowouts took weeks to be repaired. Can you imagine the catastrophic property damage and potential loss of human life. The death of livestock, birds, and wildlife in the area could be staggering.

This pipeline is being proposed by a private company, not a public utility. The company is based in Texas. Navigator is trying to force lowans to suffer with the burden on their money-making scheme. Do you think the bank in Deep River will see any financial benefit from this pipeline? Or how about the town of Deep River or our Deep River Fire Dept. or for that matter our county as a whole. The state of Iowa will not be collecting taxes from them. Surely the landowners who are being paid a small pittance and expected to live with this thing for the rest of their lives are not truly benefitting. lowans are being asked to take all the risks so a private Texas company can get rich.

I am asking you, The Iowa Utilities Board members, to stand with your fellow lowans and do what is right for our state. Do everything in your power to stop the Navigator CO2 Pipeline and vote no to giving them eminent domain.

With the research I have done, this pipeline poses a much greater threat than other pipelines to more individuals due to the fact it is heavier than air. I am a landowner in Poweshiek County. My farmland will be impacted by the Navigator pipeline. I am very concerned about the potential loss of income and land value due to the pipeline. Navigator offers to pay a partial loss for 3 years. Past pipeline projects have proven to reduce income off the land involved for several years after construction is finished.


Navigator's use of heavy equipment will compact the soil in my field causing long term effects on production. Even if topsoil is removed and then replaced, similar projects in the past have shown reductions in crop production. Much of my land is tiled for drainage. The pipeline runs across the tiling and will cut or crush a large amount of my tiling. Repairing all this tiling will cost thousands of dollars. Who will pay for this? If Navigator does pay for the initial tiling expenses, I am concerned there will be more issues later on. I have heard of many farmers incurring further expense to repair damage that is not initially recognizable. I am also concerned the area may lay differently after the pipeline is put in. The drainage patterns of the fields may take several years to recognize, especially if settling occurs in the area. Who is going to take care of the costs 5 years from now if there is a drainage problem caused by the pipeline? This is my livelihood, my home, I cannot move my business elsewhere. The potential loss of income and property damage to myself and farmers all across the state is devastating.

I am also concerned about the potential loss of property value. I have no plans to sell our century farm but my land is part of my over-all personal wealth. My land will be passed on to my children. In areas where natural gas pipelines have been built the effected land has seen a 5%-40% decrease in value. Natural gas is at least a needed utility. A CO2 pipeline is a money-making build for Navigator at the expense of all the landowners who are victims of their plan.

Navigator is not an Iowa based company. The profits from this project will never be invested in our communities. The money will never reach our local banks. Farmers will suffer a loss of income, a loss of land value, and the insecurity of living with a potentially dangerous pipeline in their backyards. Navigator's pipeline is not a public utility. All profits go to Navigator and its investors. The infrastructure is owned privately. Because they are a private business, they have no right to use eminent domain to take land.

I have talked with many local farmers effected by this and have found NO ONE who actually supports it. Iowa's farmers will be left with scarred, depleted, devalued land while Navigator enjoys the profit. Their home base of Texas rakes in the tax income. Iowans, the state of Iowa, and local communities will pay for Navigators gains. I am asking you to please do everything in your power to stop the Navigator Pipeline. While I do not have a "dog in this fight" as some would say, because I have no property that will be directly impacted. I do wish to comment upon it's merits. I learned of this pipeline because I sit as a volunteer on the Linn County Historical Preservation Commission. As I understand the proposed route, it would be near one of our historical properties near Mt Vernon (Abby Creek Cemetery, I believe). So our Commission was notified, and I attended a meeting in Manchester to learn about this proposed project.

My view on the public usage of private land reflects the ideas of a retired carpenter, and I certainly do not know or understand all the laws associated with eminent domain. My understanding on eminent domain, is that it is a tool to serve the overall good of all the people. So as I tried to understand what Navigator Ventures and Heartland Greenway wants to do, it became apparent to me anyway that this project would do very little if anything at all to provide a good or service that is helpful to the vast majority of Iowans, or even the general citizenry of the USA. Contrary to that position, it is entirely inevitable that the direct costs for all aspects of this project will eventually in one way or another be passed down to the end consumer. The cost / benefit analysis of this project would seem to be enough alone to kill it.

The idea of trying to reduce carbon dioxide emissions to somehow make a difference to our weather and climate appears to not be a goal of the Heartland Greenway project. I personally stood at the Manchester meeting and asked a presenter for Heartland what effect this project would have on global carbon dioxide, and her response was that it would be "unmeasurable" According to this presenter, the Heartland Greenway pipeline would be just one very small piece in the overall world-wide attempt at climate change.

What became apparent as the meeting continued, was that the ethanol plants or other entities would somehow benefit from tax credits and other such political payouts so as to make their product more competitive in the market.

If this is true, then the idea of using other people's land to benefit a

Against our will, our land was condemned to allow the construction of the Dakota Access Pipeline several years ago. Now Navigator wishes to install another pipeline across the same piece of ground. I have several questions:

1. Is it fair to require landowners to bear the unwanted burden of several pipelines across the same piece of ground? The value we received for Dakota was a pittance compared to the permanent destruction of the ability to use and enjoy our property. Now you want us to accept ANOTHER pipeline? The state should just buy our property from us, since we will now be completely unable to sell it or use it for anything other than what the state wants.
2. What are the safety and environmental issues involved in locating the pipeline in proximity to the Dakota pipeline? Is Navigator aware of the existing pipeline and considered the impacts of a leak or rupture in the Dakota pipeline or in the planned CO2 pipeline? We are the owners of a fourth generation farm. With this honor, it holds more history and sacrifice than you could type out in a letter. As with many family farms, the land has been entrusted to us by our ancestors- to do what is right, be good stewards of the land, and in due time pass it on to the next generation.

When we were informed of a possible CO2 pipeline running through this farm our hearts sank and an element of concern overwhelmed us. Although sadly, this is not something completely unfamiliar as we already have a current gas pipeline AND power high line running across our land. We feel that we have paid our dues and have had enough.

At the 2021 December meeting in Linn County we walked out feeling more anxious and discouraged. This was the worst part as we were informed of by a random phone call that was received by my husband on his way to work, literally 3 hours before the meeting. Most of our neighbors received no notice at all! The Navigator team said that all land owners were informed by certified mail- which was not the case for us and many in our neighborhood. We still to this day have not received anything by mail with more information about the pipeline. Can you even imagine finding out this way? A massive slap of information on a project so intrusive and personal and then for it to be brought up to you at the last minute- it's just downright nauseating.

The Navigator "team of experts" was absolutely nothing of the sort. Many questions could not be answered, and instead of providing detailed information about this project they gave scripted, vague, responses. Many questions were left unanswered, the most important being, "how is this pipeline going to benefit me?" "What about my neighbors?" "How is this benefiting the state of Iowa?" It appears that the only thing green here is more money and not cleaner air for Iowa. ADA corn sweeteners already have a system in place for CO2 capture- why are they running a pipeline to

their plant when they won't be using it?

With all of the uncertainty fuming through our area, you can see why we are a bit discouraged. Besides this, I am also very puzzled as to the proposed route for the pipeline. Linn County is the second most populated county in the state of Iowa. The farm ground here is very productive and has the potential for development on some of the most desirable ground in Iowa. Our location in relation to major cities and excellent school districts makes Linn County farm ground one of the most expensive per acres in the state. The proposed pipeline would end the possibility for so much potential development, not to mention it would devalue our property. Our ground would be absolutely worthless to sell for our future generations.

Our neighbor to the east of our farm is a first responder for the city of Mount Vernon. I asked him about what would happen in the event of a pipeline break and the response time that we could expect him to get to us. He simply shook his head and said that it wouldn't matter; neither human nor animal would survive in this event. Not only are they not properly trained for such an incident, they are not equipped for this either.

Our farm is our legacy, something we will pass on to our children and future generations. It is our hope and desire that this CO2 pipeline never has a place on our land and in our beautiful state.

Dear Members of the Iowa Utilities Board,

I'm filing an objection in an open docket against HLP-2021-0003 (Navigator CO2 Ventures LLC, Petition for a Hazardous Liquid Pipeline Permit).

I do not believe that Dallas-based Navigator CO2 Ventures and their partners, Valero and BlackRock, have the best interests of Iowa farmers and Iowa landowners at heart. They say they are pro-ag and "green," but they need to come clean about all the risks that we'll face after they use our land to build pipelines carrying deadly, liquid CO2.

I love my land, my livelihood, my family, and my rights. This Texas-based corporation is not looking out for the future of rural Iowans like me and is not welcome here.

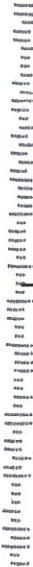

I would like to voice my opinions and objections regarding the Heartland Greenway Navigator CO2 pipeline (Docket HLP-2021-0003).

For over 25 years, I have been employed in the natural gas pipeline industry. Pipelines have blessed our family with a good life. The good wages that come with working in the natural gas pipeline industry has enabled us to build a new house, purchase multiple farms over the years, and buy investment properties.

I started as a meter reader, worked my way thru a welding apprenticeship, and was then promoted to a Senior Gas Service Technician Crew Leader. I am very familiar with the 192 DOT codes for pipeline construction, operations and maintenance. I have been involved in all aspects of welding construction, destructive testing, nick break, bend test, X-ray, air testing, hydro testing, leak survey (walking, mobile and aerial), high consequence areas, patrols, road and rail casing crossings, cathodic protection, anode installation and maintenance, rectifier voltage, millivolt potential inspections, bond/shunt inspections with other pipelines crossing in the same area, leak investigations, locates, appliance operations, hit lines, and the list goes on and on. I guess what I am trying to say is that we have been able to build a great life for our family because of the pipeline industry, and I know that pipelines are one of the safest and most reliable means of transporting products from one location to another.

Amber and I got married over 20 years ago, and started our dreams together of building a house in the country and starting a family. In 2000 we bought 17 acres, built a 220 foot bridge over the creek, and moved a mobile home onto the property. In 2003 we bought another 120 acres of farm land that bordered our property. We worked on building our house from 2008 thru 2011, shedding a lot of blood, sweat and tears as we did most of the construction on our own while raising 2 small children and working. In 2012 we welcomed our third child, and purchased another 25 acres, again adjoining our property. In 2013 we bought roughly 2 acres of timber land along the creek, and the last land purchase we made was about a 70 acre parcel of 100% timber land just east of our house, also bordering our existing property. Since the day we bought our initial 17 acres, we hoped the day would come that the

timber land east of our house would go up for sale, because those trees would be the perfect buffer for our home. It was our greatest fear that someone would log off the trees or build houses on the timber property next to us. So, in the middle of a global pandemic, in November of 2020, that timber land next to us went up for auction. We were the highest bidder. Buying the property at the price we paid made no logical sense. But we were determined that no one would ever cut those trees down in our lifetime. So we bought it, and enrolled it in a forest reserve program. This came at a cost. I always work the over time, we mow lawns for extra money, our family does not take vacations, we have never owned new vehicles, we do not have RV's, motorcycles or boats. My truck is 25 years old and I have been driving it for the last 15 years. Those trees mean the world to our family. It is a buffer for our house, a home to lots of wildlife, a peaceful place to take a walk thru the woods, shade from the hot summer sun for our horses, and an awesome place to hunt.

If Heartland Greenway Navigator CO2 pipeline builds on their projected route, it will go right thru the middle of our timber ground, robbing us of those trees we so dearly love. Granting a pipeline construction easement thru our woods will destroy thousands of trees older than you and I. The woods will never be the same. New trees can be planted, but in my lifetime, they will never get as big as they are now. It will take decades for the wildlife to come back as abundant as they are today. Erosion will be a concern on the land stripped of the trees, not to mention the fact that trees are a necessary part of a healthy environment, oxygenating the air we all breathe.

I am not opposed to a CO2 pipeline being constructed, but I am opposed to it being constructed on the land of property owners like me and my wife. I beg of you to only allow pipeline construction along the public right of way, so that my property and many others' property will not be subjected to the ill effects of construction damage.

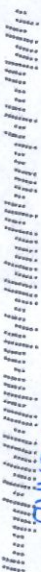

I am submitting comments regarding HLP-2021-0003 and the potential impact it
may have on our family owned farm at [403 Upper Boulder Rd, Coggon, Iowa](#).

Our first and foremost concern is the long-term impact this project will have on the productivity of our farm. Heartland's proposal to pay damages over three years on a decreasing scale of 100%, 80% and 60% has left us baffled. If the pipeline causes damages, why would they not pay the entire cost? Also, how do they think damages end after the third year? Our family does considerable custom harvesting in the Linn and Jones County areas, including harvesting on properties that have a 1970's era Natural Gas pipeline running through them. I can assure you that after over 40 years, we still see significant yield reductions on our monitor as we cross the pipeline route. During years where the crop is stressed the differences are especially noticeable. This impacts the producer's long-term income and also the property value. For us to even consider agreement to the pipeline would require substantial guarantees that we would receive compensation for ongoing impact to our production.

Our other question is why is this project even being pursued? It seems obvious the the current party in power at the national level does not support ethanol as a long-term answer to our energy needs. This being the case, it would appear that by 2035 ethanol demand will be virtually eliminated. Again, for us to consider entering into such an agreement with Heartland, we as producers have to have clear guarantees this project will enhance demand for our product.
