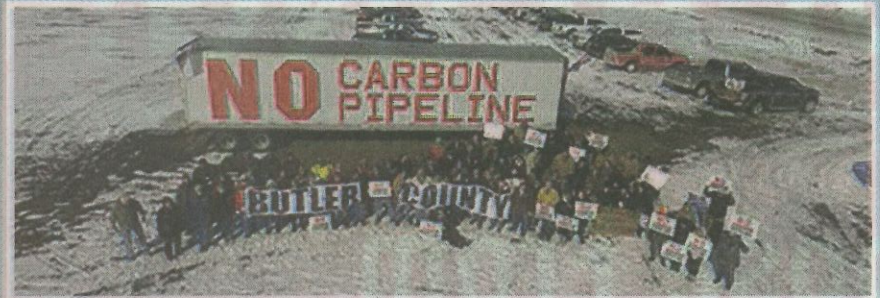

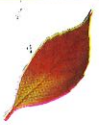

I wish to address the IUB about the CO2 pipelines that are proposed to cross land owned by Woodbury County and privately owned lands in Woodbury County. I object to this move for the following reasons:

The land is owned by Woodbury County and other land owners, especially farmers within our county, which means that the taxpayers of Woodbury County own this land. We, as taxpayers need to have input as to what is proposed for this property. We are the owners and care takers of this land and should have the right to manage the land and its use as we see fit. We have been told by the CO2 companies that if we do not voluntarily sign the agreement to let the Summit Carbon Solutions surveyors on the land to take soil samples and stake out the pipeline that they can take the easement by Condemnation and Eminent Domain. Summit Carbon Solutions is a **for profit, privately owned company** that is funded by large amounts of private monies and corporate investors. The Iowa Board of Utilities has been given the power to grant Eminent Domain to a private company if the "pipeline services to be rendered will promote the public convenience and necessity, and an affirmative finding to that effect is a condition precedent to granting of a permit". Where in the law is a listing of the criteria that must be fulfilled in order to grant the necessity and public convenience of a hazardous CO2 pipeline? It is neither a necessity nor a public convenience, for the county or the landowners/farmers of Woodbury County. What the pipeline will do is to the reduce the value of the land plus make the management of the land more difficult, if not impossible, for future development and use. According to the US Constitution and the Laws of Iowa, we have a right to receive "just compensation" for relinquishing our land to a publicly owned company or utility for the use that will benefit the interest of the public and will be used by the public, such as a park for public use, a public highway, an electrical substation or highline structures for the routing of electricity to the public, or a rural water line for which the water is used for residents in the area. Who plans on using the liquid CO2 in the Summit Carbon Solutions pipeline? How is this or any other pipeline like this one going to benefit the county or the private landowner as well as the general public? When we received our deed to the farmland at the time of purchase, we acquired the right to manage and take care of that land to the best of our ability, which we and the county have done. Our federal and local tax dollars are being used to the benefit of these privately owned companies to share with their investors and we are told that we may not have a voice to object to what the company sees as their right to take over land that is owned by farmers and other land owners? Sounds much like what is going on in China and Russia. Eminent Domain is just a means for them to gain access to the county property and the farmland of Woodbury County. If my neighbor wants to have a CO2 pipeline across his/her property, that is their business, but don't tell me that I also have to have a pipeline on my property. **Eminent Domain for private companies, privately funded, and is for profit for the**

owner and investors, not for the landowner. According to the numerous studies that I have read through in my research on this matter, a CO2 pipeline can not only be dangerous, but also is not scientifically supported by a majority of the scientific community. It is up to the IUB three (3) board members to either approve or disapprove these pipelines for the State of Iowa. How can three people be granted so much power without the approval and consent of the owner of the land that will be affected by an approval of the IUB? By an approval and the granting of Eminent Domain, you are taking away my\our right to say "NO" to the pipeline on our property. Does this sound fair to you, the IUB? I wish to suggest to the IUB members that they take into consideration what they would do if this same scenario was happening to land that they own and are living near or on at the present time. Oh yes, I forgot that the head of the IUB sits on the governor's Carbon Sequestration Task Force Board and also has a vote on that board. This sounds like letting the fox guard the hen house. Has the head of the IUB ever contemplated the fact that this is a conflict of interest and considered resigning from the IUB so that she can serve on this board?

I believe that you know where I and numerous other farmers/landowners stand on this issue.

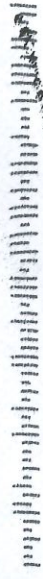

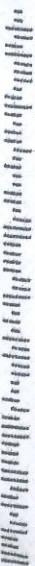

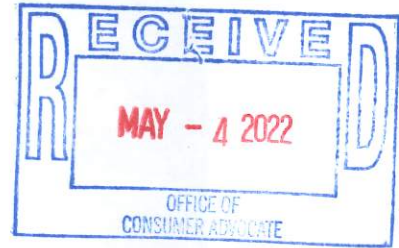

To the Iowa Utilities Board:

We have watched with interest the debate over the carbon pipelines proposed to remove carbon dioxide from ethanol plants across Iowa, transport the CO₂ across the state, and then pump it into underground reservoirs in North Dakota and Illinois. This is not a letter about the potential long-term negative impacts of pipelines on the soils of Iowa, the high cost per ton of that CO₂ removal, or the community disruption involved in constructing the pipeline. Rather, we want to make you aware of other technologies that would utilize this CO₂ source as a green fuel that would directly benefit Iowa producers and the Iowa economy.

The technology captures the CO₂ from the ethanol plant and converts it into e-methanol – a net zero “green” fuel – which could be used as a fuel source for producers. The system would be located at each plant and the e-methanol produced would be stored and distributed back to producers as part of the cooperative of the ethanol plant. Excess e-methanol could be sold to a wide range of companies – it is currently in high demand and that demand will continue to increase as companies continue to expand their decarbonization efforts. It is estimated that each ethanol plant would produce 29 million gallons of e-methanol per year which would be recycled into grain produced for the ethanol plant and other uses. Note that the commercial value of that e-methanol is more than \$110 Million at current prices. Using this technology creates an entirely “green” fuel because it would be plant derived —the CO₂ was recently taken out of the air by plants and is being returned to the air when burned – net zero.

There would be two sources of fuel generated in each ethanol plant, ethanol (already produced) and e-methanol, with both enhancing the Iowa economy. Implementation of this technology would provide multiple benefits. First, there would be no impact on the soil resource of Iowa by installing pipelines and a further savings in carbon resources from the energy required to install pipelines and transport the CO₂ to the deposition location. Second, the e-methanol production facility would be co-located at the ethanol plant eliminating the need for costly and disruptive pipeline transport and storage. Third, the “green” fuel generated would be used as a fuel source for producers supplying grain to the ethanol plant. Fourth, operation of each facility would create additional jobs in rural communities where ethanol plants are located.

We believe that alternative technologies to utilize the CO₂ generated from ethanol plants bears a close examination on the value for the Iowa economy. The attached document describes this technology in detail.

We request a phone call to discuss the approach outlined in this letter.

Members of the Board,

I have found many examples of Summit and Navigator providing different information to landowners in different states. Below are a couple recent examples. It is disingenuous for the pipeline companies to provide different information in different states. It creates a lack of trust and transparency with the public. The public cannot believe anything the pipeline companies say if they continue to mislead and provide inaccurate information.

1) Navigator & Enhanced Oil Recovery

At the in-person information meeting in Polk County, when asked about enhanced oil recovery Navigator representatives said because they are a common carrier, they do not have any control over how the CO2 is used. They said they cannot stop a customer from doing EOR.

In a recent article published on [5.11.22 in the Brookings Register](#), the article states "Officials from both pipelines proposed for South Dakota say the captured carbon will be sequestered and not used for enhanced oil production."

This is a big discrepancy in what Navigator is telling the public in different states about the end use of the CO2.

2) Summit and pumping stations

Summit has continually told Iowa landowners that there will only be 2 pumping stations in Iowa and they aren't sure where they will be yet. However, a filing in South Dakota shows 5 pumping stations in Iowa with the general location of the pumping stations. Why is Summit providing different information in different states? (South Dakota map with 5 pumping stations in Iowa is attached)

The pipeline companies should be expected to be transparent and factual. If not, there is no reason these projects should be approved.
